Dear Families

I would like to bring to your attention some forthcoming key dates:

- **Friday 15th February**

The Academy will close for the half term break at 15:10.

- **Monday 25th February**

The Academy will open for students at 8.35am. Students will follow week 1 of their timetable.

- **Tuesday 26th February**

Students in years 7 and 11 will have their form and year group photos taken in the course of the day. This is a normal school day for all students.

- **Tuesday 5th March – Parents' Afternoon for Years 11, 12 and 13**

Parents' Afternoon for students in Years 11, 12 and 13 from 1:30pm until 6:00pm.

The Academy will close at 12:30pm for all students.

- **Tuesday 26th March – Parents' Afternoon for Year 10**

Parents' Afternoon for students in Year 10 from 1:30pm until 5:00pm.

The Academy will close at 12:30pm for all students.

- **Tuesday 9th April – Parents' Afternoon for Year 8**

Parents' Afternoon for students in Year 8 from 1:30pm until 5:00pm.

The Academy will close at 12:30pm for all students.

- **Friday 12th April**

The Academy will close for all students at 12:00 noon on Friday 12th April for the Easter break and will open for students at 8:35am on Monday 29th April. Students will follow week 2 of their timetable.

Revision sessions

The Academy will run revision sessions during the Easter Break and the May Half Term break as well as on the following Saturdays:

Details of the Easter revision sessions will be shared with students and families in April.

Students required to attend these revision sessions will be informed separately; students can also check on display boards by the restaurant which revision sessions they are required to attend.

Electronic devices

Recently, there has been much discussion about the impact social media is having on the lives of young people. Clearly, the medium of communication, is, electronic devices, including mobile phones. We do not allow students to use their phones and electronic devices in the Academy. Any devices should remain off and out of sight whilst students are on the premises.

I would also suggest parents and carers periodically check children's devices with a view to monitoring use. If something comes to your attention that is of concern, please feel free to contact the year team, and we will endeavour to help or signpost you to possible areas of support.

Examinations

All students must attend the Academy as normal during examination periods. Students involved in exams must be in the Academy's theatre by 8:35am for morning exams and by 12:50pm for afternoon exams.

Appointments and Interviews

Can I please ask that you make every effort to arrange these outside of Academy hours?

Unauthorised Absence

The Academy is unable to approve requests for holiday during term time, the Department of Education guidance on this matter is very clear. Consequently such absence will be unauthorised.

Students cycling to the Academy

Prior to cycling to the Academy, we ask that parents/carers complete a cycle permit form; we cannot allow any bicycles on site without a completed form. A key element of the permit form is that the student wears an appropriate cycle helmet whilst riding their bike to and from the Academy. Can I please ask that parents/carers ensure their child has a helmet and wears it?

Free School Meals

Can I remind families that your son/daughter is eligible for free school meals if you meet any of the following criteria:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on - paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit - if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

Children who get any of the above benefits in their own right (ie they get benefits payments directly, instead of through a parent or guardian) can also get free school meals.

To apply or renew your application for Free School Meals on-line you can:

- Apply on-line at www.link2ict.org/FSM
- This is a one off application for your child's whole school career – your eligibility will be checked electronically every week (replacing the need to bring paperwork into the Academy).

Nut allergies

We have a number of students at our Academy who have been diagnosed as having a nut allergy. As a consequence, I would kindly request, you avoid including nut-based products in packed lunches.

Water

As you will be aware from previous letters, the only drink allowed on site is water. Water can be purchased and consumed in the Academy restaurant. Students can also fill their reusable bottles (not those purchased with water in) at various locations in the Academy. Students will be able to buy, at cost price, reusable bottles from the Academy.

Water bottles available at KESH are compliant with exam regulations. Students who use their own water bottle may not be allowed to take their water bottle in an examination room if their water bottle is not compliant with exam regulations; when this is the case, water will be provided to students.

Parking when visiting

When visiting the Academy in your car, you are welcome to bring the car on site through the Sheldon Heath Road entrance. Proceed forward, turn right and use the visitor parking. Please can you avoid parking on residential streets.

Dropping off and collecting students

Can I please ask that when dropping off or collecting your sons and daughters, you are mindful of local residents? In particular, can you please not park across drives or block pavements. You might want to consider arranging to pick up your son/daughter at a point away from Kenmure Road. Your cooperation with this matter would be very much appreciated.

House Points

Since September we have had a significant and substantial increase in the number of house points and rewards that have been issued. This is a fantastic effort by the students and to be applauded. We look forward to the trend continuing.
